Our club continues to grow, we've established some popular regular events in the calendar and sections which get together regularly. There is always room for more though, with some sections less active or needing a new leader, so if you want to represent the club or your section at an event, organise a ride or meeting and are willing to do the leg work then please let us know.

Because of the coronation, we lost our booking for the Chairman's run to Brooklands museum at the 11th hour, which was a disappointment, and unsurprisingly the hastily arranged alternative event was not very well attended (myself included) for which I can only apologise, but thank you to those who did attend.

The Dutch Morini club recently disbanded partly as a result of losing web traffic and members to Facebook groups. In support of the Dutch club, and to ensure the trove of information on the Dutch club website is preserved, we have offered to migrate the motomoriniclub.nl content onto our website and to host it indefinitely for them. This process is nearly complete and will go live later in the year.

Having volunteers is essential for the running of the club and your committee works hard for the benefit of our ≈550 members. Most of us have been in committee roles for a number of years now, and we would appreciate additional help - whether that be taking an active part in running the club, representing the club at shows and events, sending content into the magazine, etc.

Treasurer's Report 2023

For the 2021 - 2022 financial year we started the period with £25,483.85 in the bank and ended with £24,543.19 in the account.

The club remains solvent with total income being £32,991.54 and total outgoings of £35,093.87. Therefore, the club's outgoings for the year exceeded the incomings by £2,102.33. However, we have spent £2,815.81 on the club bike which included a partial rebuild and a new ignition system after not spending anything for several years, in fact less than £500 over the previous five years.

The Cadwell trackday in 2022 generated a surplus of £3,953.00 and provides a great boost to the club's funds. Associated costs were £12,412.00 with income being £16,365.00.

Membership income stands at £12,061.83 with the cost of publishing and providing ATG being £9.906.84. The remaining subs not only contribute to the costs of running the club but also subsidise the AGM and Rally Weekend.

Budget wise I'd targeted a small surplus of £900 but this only included a spend of £500 on the club bike and it needed doing. The joys of splitting the budget between both Operational and Capital expenditure, allows us to do this without financial risk to the running of the club.

Looking forward we are also going to need to replace the Editor's Mac as it's getting to the end of its useful life and ATG doesn't create itself.

As at 1st September 2023 the bank balance was £23,726.58.

Compared to 1st August 2022 membership has increased by 34.

87 new or returning members joined in the last year: again, as in previous years, the most popular choice is a 3½ Strada followed by 3½ Sport, 6 new members with 1200s but still, so far, no new members with the new 650s.

New members were signed up from the North of Scotland to the far South West, from West Wales to Norfolk, from USA to New Zealand, the club indeed has a worldwide presence. 5 members of the former Dutch club took up the offer of free virtual membership as a gesture of good will from the MRC.

Around 53 members did not renew, a low turnover of about 10% of the membership per annum is I think a measure of the fact that for many members Morinis are a "keeper".

The membership secretary continues to field questions about logins; both website and forum, and it has to be said that some of the correspondence is at times quite amusing. Seriously though, the management of logins and passwords could be more efficiently handled by a new Webmaestro.

There will also be substantial need for help for next year's International Rally as the editor played a large role in the organization of the last one and it is less than a year away, so all offers of support are welcome and encouraged.

Web-maestro (resigning) 2023

The webmaestro position is currently vacant and we have been appealing for a volunteer to take this on for a number of years now. The role needs somebody with the time and knowledge to move the website forwards as well as deal with ad hoc technical support and questions from members.

In the absence of a webmaestro today I will report on the main points:

- Over the last year we have upgraded our web hosting to give us more space, which will also enable us
 to host the Dutch club website as an online archive going into the future.
- Our web hosting, including club email and the forum costs around £240 per year which represents good value to the club and meets our needs currently.
- Traffic to our forum is still fairly high and it is one of the most valuable online Morini resources. The
 website itself is well overdue a technical and content update which we need help with. I would say
 that if we can't find a volunteer very soon, the club may have to consider outsourcing the role which
 would be costly and probably not convey enough of the wealth of knowledge the club has.

Products 2023

Summary: It has been a good year for the Club and Product sales have reflected this. We restocked the rubber side panel pins and had another batch of ATG Binders produced as a result of repeated requests. Print on Demand clothing products remain successful; the Cadwell T-shirt is a popular one-off annual production and we sold 30 this year. The 2023 Calendar was slower to sell out this year, with the last two copies only going in June!

Numbers:

Web sales for the FY 2021-22 year (ie. up to end October 2022) were at £1,685 plus post charges of £318.95. The postage costs were £278.53; this excludes £32 for posting preordered calendars sent in the current FY. Stock value of sales was £1,286 giving us a 'margin' of over 20%, below standard retail levels. As we offer a service to members we can continue to operate with this approach - especially as many of our sales are now print on demand and we continue to manage stock level values which we aim to keep in the range of £2,000-2,500. Restocking has pushed the current (mid-2023) figure to the limit of this range.

Highlights:

- The move the Club made to offering 'print on demand products' such as the Cadwell T giving a strong contribution to on-line sales.
- Managing stock levels through the use of Print on Demand has meant that we have reduced our levels of stock, and therefore financial risk to the Club.
- Returning to Motorcycle Shows has been a double-edged sword it allows us to present a public face to fellow Morini riders but increases cost to the Club, and with generally lower attendances pure sales income remains insufficient to cover these.
- Rubber side panel pin costs continue to sell well. Increased costs to the Club at the time of restocking will be passed on once we have sold old stock.
- The Club Calendar remains popular, and is also a useful PR item.
- Total sales for the year contributed £400 to Club funds, as well as giving members access to a great range of quality items that helps publicise our Club.

Thanks; to Julie and Butch for their help in offering a range of products at shows; to David for putting together our most collectable calendar, to Tom for work with the web shop, design and creating the line of print on demand items, and to you all for supporting the Club through your purchases over the year.

BMF/MAG 2023

Andy Carrott outlined the case for the MRC's continued affiliation of both MAG and the BMF. He gave an update of the current activities and state of both organisations highlighting that the BMF had made the decision to leave the Federation of European Motorcyclists Associations, stating cost as the primary consideration although the UK leaving the EU was a factor. MAG is also considering its membership. Most BMF campaigns activity is now via the National Motorcycle Council whereas MAG employs its own campaigns and political team. Both organisations continue to work on theft, licensing, parking and taxation issues. Driverless cars and Emissions/Congestion charging are a particular focus. In answer to a question Andy cited success in both Oxford and Cambridge in respect to exemption from charges plus the ULEZ exemption in London for older bikes passing independent testing. MAG also has particular focus on reversing the proposed ban on petrol engine motorcycles.
